Many thanks all involved to make such a good team!



This month's Gardening Notes

Here are your gardening notes for October all about getting your garden ready for autumn.

Garden Jobs for October

- Plant garlic. Buy this in, don't use a bulb from the supermarket.
- Field beans are about the only green manure which you can sow now, but it's a gamble if they come up. Similarly, try sowing broad beans now for an earlier spring crop but this far north both tend to rot in the ground rather than grow.
- Remove yellowing leaves from overwintering brassicas as they will only encourage moulds and slugs.
- Dig over and dig in manure/compost as you clear the ground of crops.
 This can destroy the structure and environment of the micro living world of

- the soil so have a think about setting up some no-dig beds. Autumn and winter are good times to do this. There's lots on the internet.
- Harvest the beans left for seed. Leave the pods to finish drying off inside
 and then shell your seeds and store them in paper envelopes in an air
 tight container in a cool, dark frost free space. Don't forget to label them
 with the variety (if you can remember) and the date/year of collection so
 you know what you have and when they are likely to lose viability.
- Leave old stalks and stems in for the over wintering insects. I leave sweet corn, sunflowers and teasels in until all danger of frost is past next spring.
- Harvest the last of the tomatoes and chilis. Green ones will turn red if
 placed next to a ripe banana or just in the bowl with the red ones. Or make
 chutney.

COP 26 Section



What is COP 26?

The UK will host the 26th UN Climate Change Conference of the Parties (COP26) in Glasgow on 1 – 12 November 2021.

The COP26 summit will bring people - with representatives that include heads of state, climate experts and negotiators - from across the globe together to step up action towards tackling the climate crisis. As well as the negotiations, there will also be the opportunity for countries, international organisations and other delegates to share knowledge by showcasing climate action and highlight the many diverse issues caused by the climate crisis.

As we in Carlisle are so closely placed to Glasgow, we will be seeing lots of people coming through our city in the lead up to COP26. Below are some of the events that will be taking place, we will be sure to keep you up to date with further details, updates and happenings.

Pilgrimage For Nature - Listening to the Land

Kriya Arts will be coming to Carlisle on their Pilgrimage For Nature on 10/11th October, staying over at <u>Susan's Farm</u>. Here's what they will be up to...

10th Oct: Blessing in Carlisle cathedral.


11th Oct: Performance at Houghton School (not for general public).

"Listening to the Land Pilgrimage for Nature is a collective walk from London to the UN climate conference in Glasgow to be held in autumn this year. We will listen deeply to what the land and her people are asking from humanity, as a species envisaging how to transform and align our relationship to the natural world, and present our findings to those in power as a People's Charter For The Land.

We will also gather stories, dreams and hopes from places and people we meet along the way. Joining us on the pilgrimage will be theatre makers and artists, curating this walk as an extended piece of promenade theatre that will result in a final performance presented at COP26 in Glasgow. Created by the people and the land, for and about the people and the land."

CAMINO TO COP EVENTS

'This is a walk for everyone, although initiated by XRUK Faith Bridge. We will be walking from London and Bristol to Glasgow. Leaving London on Sunday 5th September, leaving Bristol on the 9th September and arriving in Glasgow on 30th October.

The purpose of the walk is to build alliances and engage communities along the route – faith communities and other local communities – and to spread the word about the urgency of the need for meaningful action to address the global climate and ecological emergency. This is an opportunity for connection and outreach and is expressly not a physically disruptive or civilly disobedient action. Those involved are asked to sign up to this principle.'

WALK WITH PUSH, TALK WITH PUSH, IN THE PUSH FOR CLIMATE JUSTICE

Hear from Pushpanath (Push) Krishnamurthy in Keswick on Saturday 23rd October on his fantastic journey to COP 26.

'Walking with a purpose has a profound meaning across time and culture. Walking has been used as a social, spiritual and political action, from pilgrimages to hunger marches. We can walk almost anywhere, we don't need to be told how to do it, you can be unfit or energetic, and it's free. We can walk for our own well-being, and we can walk for change. I do it because of what Gandhi says below. My walks are about inspiring actions for fair play, creating

awareness through compelling stories of real life. They are about opportunity and hope.'

"We're walking from London to Glasgow in October for Cop 26. We're doing this to inform ourselves and others on the urgency and importance of climate action now, by each of us, individually and together.

We want to use the occasion of COP 26, in Glasgow in November, and the mechanism of a walk to engage individuals and groups on climate change. We will explore personal perspectives on:

- the impact of climate change;
- · the urgency felt;
- the sense of agency; and
- the appetite for taking action.

We will be prepared to educate and inform across 4 key areas: climate change and CoP 26, national and local government, businesses, and civil society.

The stories we hear and record on the walk will be played back during the walk on social media, at the events we plan, and on completion in a research plan and short film."
